Summary of the April Membership Questionnaire

Thank you for completing the questionnaires. We have tried to summarize the results and want to implement as many of your suggestions as possible.

This is what we found:

 The membership is virtually unanimous on the point that the most important activity of the Art League is to display its members'

work.

- Almost as significant are the monthly gallery talks with judges.
- Most artists favored an annual Art League meeting, year-around shows, solo or twoand three-person shows, and workshops and other related activities.
- People preferred that there be some shows without themes or that themes be broader in scope.

 Some suggested that artists receiving awards speak about their work during gallery talks.


In terms of complaints a number of artists felt that:

- the quality of judges could be improved;
- judges should not take themes too literally;
- sales and marketing needed to be improved; and
- the food at the gallery openings was not what it could be.

Upcoming Events

The members expressed interest in a broader range of activities. One event which has been developed in cooperation with CHAW is a five-week course on the History of American Art, featuring the noted actor and scholar, Emery Battis. Each lecture will include slides prepared by the Smithsonian museum system and will be about an hour long, with refreshments afterwards. The series will run for five Monday evenings—from September 24th to October 29th. Call CHAW for more information and cost.

We are also planning a Saturday workshop in watercolor with an excellent teacher, David Daniels, from Takoma Park. This will be a winter event at the Workshop.
