Rosemary Feit-Covey is an American printmaker whose artwork is in the National Museum of History in New York, the Corcoran Gallery of Art and international galleries. Jurying November CHAL exhibit "It's A Private Passion", Rosemary's advice centered on focus of artists' work. "Artists can take common scenes or objects and make them special," said Rosemary. "I don't think artists have to break new ground to produce great art." Rosemary picked works that had a strong point of view, as she said, "the artists committed themselves to their subject matter, and expressed that with color or clarity in focus."

Twenty-nine CHAL member artists had art selected, and it filled the ground and first floors at the community center on Pennsylvania Avenue SE on Capitol Hill. # **CHAL Tours Vivid Solutions**

On October 20, 2012, five CHAL members and friends toured Vivid Solutions (VS), a project of The ARCH Development Corporation which is a community- based not-for-profit organization in Historic Anacostia

The Vivid Solutions DC Print Lab provides the highest technical performance of state-ofthe-art digital imaging equipment to achieve optimum print quality. The print shop uses Epson equipment, and has some of the top of the line printers both in quality and size.

Shannon Holloway, Assistant Lab Technician, gave us a great tour, answering many questions we had about the printing process. Vivid Solutions works with both professionals and budding photographers. VS encourages artists/photographers to bring in their files and is happy to provide advice on kinds of paper on which to print. VS always runs one or two trials before printing a final.

In addition to their regular print service, Vivid Solutions is the only print lab in the United States that offers the Digigraphie printing process. It is an Epson process that employs specific ICC color profiles for each type of printer/paper combination. Each paper is tested and measured on a weekly basis to ensure that the most accurate gamut of colors is being reproduced before printing begins. Only 30 editions are allowed to be printed, but the artist can print any number at one time, come back years later print more, and be assured the print is identical to the original prints. It is a preferred method of print by many galleries and museums around the world. Prices for services are available on their website-www.vividsolutionsdc.com. CHAL members are encouraged to come by for a consultation. The print lab is just across the Anacostia River at 2208 Martin Luther King Avenue, Washington, DC.
