September

Members' Juried Show Walk on the Wild Side - Honoring Wally Szyndler

The juror is Kris Swanson of the Corner Store. Our September show will be in honor of our dear friend and creative artist, Wally Szyndler. The theme is inspired by his joie de vivre, his fascination with life, and the gesture of transforming inanimate objects into works of art.

Also, the 2010-2011 season will inaugurate the Wally Szyndler Award for Wild Excellence in 3-D Art.

<u>Please note</u> that the Receiving dates for the September show are a week earlier than normal because of the Labor Day holiday. The Opening Reception is still on the 2^{nd} Saturday.

CHAL Annual Meeting - Saturday, September 25, 3-5 pm at CHAW in the gallery Meet and mingle with your fellow Art League members, hear about the upcoming year, offer opinions and suggestions about how to make this our best year ever. ARTSMASH CHAW's main fundraiser, ArtSmash, will be held October 2, from 7 to 10pm at CHAW. As in past years, CHAW splits the proceeds with the donor artist. Small, "take home" works sell the best. ArtSmash supports CHAW's tuition assistance, outreach, and education programs. The silent auction will feature works from local artists and members of the Capitol Hill Art League, unique experiences, and a wide array of prizes from retail items to gift certificates and jewelry. ArtSmash will host an array of entertainment from dancers to cabaret singers.

All award-winners from the 2008-2009 and 2009-2010 seasons are invited to submit works for ArtSmash. Additionally, submitting artists are asked to provide an artist's bio and digital photos of the submitted works. CHAW is displaying the bios with the art during the event. And the photos of submitted works will go on CHAW's web site in advance of the event as a preview. Forms for submissions and the bios will be e-mailed in early September. For 15 minutes, one of the area's most knowledgeable and experienced arts professionals will answer questions about the direction of your work, pricing, presentation, approaching galleries, entering juried competitions, marketing, getting attention from art critics, or almost anything else you can think of.

Ms. Fraser, an accomplished photographer, has over 20 years of experience as a photographer, curator, gallery Director, judge, and educator. Her work has been exhibited in numerous galleries, museums and art centers both in Europe and the United States and has won many awards. Ms. Fraser is one of the most highly collected photographers in the DC region.

New Program! Preparing Your Digital Files for Juried Shows!

In October, CHAL will present a seminar at the Capitol Hill Arts Workshop on how to adjust digital files for dpi, compression and specific MBs (mega bytes) as well as burning files to CDs. This is just the seminar for those artists wanting to expand their participation in juried shows to open-call shows around DC and even nationally. The vast majority of open-call shows require submissions to be presented via digital image files, and these files are required to meet certain format specifications. Learn how to manage these digital files with confidence! The time, date, and cost will be announced shortly.

New Program! Portfolio Critique Seminar – Saturday November 13th, 1-4pm On Saturday, November 13, at CHAW Lisa Semerad will be at CHAW to work with a group of students discussing what constitutes a great work of art. After an initial lecture, she will lead students in conducting portfolio critiques. This course offers a rare chance to learn about the nuts and bolts of a critique led by a professional artist and teacher with nearly 30 years of experience in commercial and fine art. Lisa is knowledgeable in all subjects and techniques of 2 and 3-dimensional arts at any level. She has a masterful eye and the verbal ability to convey essential concepts and corrections. Areas covered will include: assessing an artist's history, the 10 elements of evaluation, classroom protocol, guidelines for forming your own critique groups and more.

Bring finished, problematic or works in process and your reference photos if you are working from some. Each student presents a learning opportunity for the group. Lisa's goal is to have frank discussion to assist in creating clarity and direction for each artist.

What to bring:

Fine and commercial artists: Up to 5 pieces, plus photos of your past work if you like. Photographers: 12 or more, sorted and edited to your best ability as prints or on your laptop.

This event will take place from 1-4 pm November 13th at CHAW. Cost to participate is \$60 for CHAL members (\$70 for non-members). Registration for this seminar begins August 9th.
