There are no size limits if we can accommodate the piece in our gallery. There is a weight limit for two-dimensional wall mounted pieces of 30 pounds. 3-D work must be able to fit on a pedestal stand or hang on the wall.

Works must meet the hanging standards outlined in the membership handbook, available to you at the CHAL website.

If work does not meet the framing requirements, it will not be accepted for jurying. All work accepted must be for sale; and must remain in the show through the end, November  $6^{th}$ .

Non-members may also enter a CHAL juried show, for a flat submission fee of \$25.

## **Prizes:**

First Place will be awarded a solo show on the CHAL Wall in the Gallery for June, 2015.

The juror will also award second, third, and Honorable Mention(s).

About the Juror: Michael Janis developed a focus on kiln-glass after working

of the Washington Glass School, Michael has taught at the Penland School of Crafts, the Bay Area Glass Institute, and The Glass Furnace (Istanbul, Turkey). His work has been shown at major galleries and art fairs and is included in the permanent collection of the Art Institute of Chicago. In 2011, Michael mounted a solo exhibition at the Fuller Craft Museum (Massachusetts) and was named a Fulbright Scholar, among other honors. His work was featured in Corning Museum of Glass publication 'New Glass Review', and he was named a "Rising Star" by the Creative Glass Center of America. In 2012, awarded a Fulbright Scholarship, Michael went to the UK's University of Sunderland and National Glass Centre. He was an Artist-in-Residence at the Institute for International Glass Research (IIRG). American Craft Magazine profiled his work in their <a href="April/May 2013">April/May 2013</a> issue. Named a "Distinguished Artist of Glass" by the <a href="James Renwick Alliance">James Renwick Alliance</a>, Michael has lectured about his work at the Smithsonian American Art Museum.
